

MERIT SYSTEM

Professional Photographers of America

Document: COU-04-MERITS-2023.03

- 1. The Merit System shall be under the authority of Council.
- 2. Changes to the Merit System must be approved by a majority affirmative vote of Council.
- 3. Merits shall be awarded as approved by Council, and according to the Merit System.
 - 3.1 Merits shall be awarded only to members of this Association. Merits can be applied toward a Degree only if the recipient is a member of this Association.
 - 3.2. Juries shall be selected based on a rotating schedule.
 - 3.3 Rules shall be approved by the Board of Directors.
 - 3.4 PPA merits shall be awarded as follows:
 - 3.4.1 One "image merit" shall be awarded to an entry that receives either the Merit or Imaging Excellence designation in the Merit Image Review in any of the image related degree programs, which are currently:
 - 3.4.1.1 Master of Photography (Merit Code 110)
 - 3.4.1.2 Master of Wedding Photography (Merit Code 170)
 - 3.4.1.3 Master Artist (Merit Code 150)
 - 3.4.2 An Individual may receive a maximum of eight image merits in any one calendar year in each degree program.
 - 3.4.3 Speaking Merits are awarded for lectures on approved programs, instructor or lecturer at PPA School of Professional Photography or an approved school sponsored by an Community Network member as stated in the Merit Chart. For having an article published in official publications of this Association, or for service as editor of a Community Network publication, published a minimum of three times per calendar year.
 - 3.4.4 All merits which are neither Image Merits nor Speaking Merits are designated as Service Merits.

4. Degrees

- 4.1 Exceptional ability in photography and exceptional services to the profession or this Association shall be recognized by the awarding of Degrees to individuals.
- 4.2 There shall be six (6) attainable degrees, the awarding of which shall be attested to by the presentation of diplomas and insignia. A Degree shall become effective at the time of presentation of the certificate.

- 4.2.1 The Degree of *Honorary Master of Photography* (abbreviated "Hon. M.Photog.") shall only be awarded to individuals who have rendered exceptional service to the photographic profession or this Association. Recipients of this Degree need not be members of this Association.
 - 4.2.1.1 Rules for proposals for, and award of, the Degree of Honorary Master of Photography shall be set by the Board. A three-fourths vote of the Board shall be required for approval.
 - 4.2.1.2 Upon completion of his or her term of office, the President shall automatically be awarded the degree of Honorary Master of Photography.
- 4.2.2 The Degree of *Master of Photography* (abbreviated "M.Photog.") shall only be awarded to participating photographers who are PPA members in good standing and who meet the requirements outlined herein. To qualify for this Degree, the applicant must have been awarded at least twenty-five (25) Merits, of which a minimum of thirteen (13) must be Image Merits. The other merits of the required twenty-five (25) may be made up any merit types.
- 4.2.3 The Degree of *Master of Wedding Photography* (abbreviated "M.Wed.Photog.") shall only be awarded to participating photographers who PPA members in good standing and who meet the requirements outlined herein. To qualify for this Degree, the applicant must have been awarded at least twenty-five (25) Merits, of which a minimum of thirteen (13) must be Wedding Merits. The other merits of the required twenty-five (25)-may be made up of any merit types.
- 4.2.4 The degree of *Master Artist* (abbreviated "M.Artist") may only be awarded to individuals who are PPA members in good standing and who meet the requirements outlined herein. To qualify for this degree the applicant must have been awarded at least twenty-five (25) Merits, of which a minimum of thirteen (13) must be Artist Merits, or Specialist Merits. The other merits of the required twenty-five (25) may be made up of any merit types.
- 4.2.5 The degree of *Honorary Photographic Craftsman* (abbreviated "Hon.Cr.Photog") shall be awarded by the Board of Directors. This degree requires a three-fourths vote of the Board.
 - 4.2.5.1 Rules for Proposals for, and awarding of the degree of Honorary Photographic Craftsman shall be set by the Board. A three-fourths vote of the board shall be required for approval.
- 4.2.6 The degree of *Photographic Craftsman* (abbreviated "Cr.Photog.") shall only be awarded to individuals who are PPA members in good standing and who meet the requirements outlined herein To qualify for this degree, the applicant must have been awarded at least twenty-five (25) total Merits, of which a minimum of thirteen (13) must be Speaking Merits. The other merits of the required twenty-five (25) total may be made up of any merit types.
- 4.3 An individual holding the degree of Master of Photography, Master of Wedding Photography, Master Artist, Master of Electronic Imaging, or Photographic Craftsman may,

if qualified, be awarded other degrees. Under this provision, the applicant must have been awarded a total of fifty (50) or more appropriate merits for two degrees, and twenty-five (25) or more appropriate merits for each additional degree. Once a Merit is applied toward a degree, the merits used to obtain that degree are considered void for future application, and may not be used again. Holders of multiple degrees must use the following abbreviations in this order followed by any other credentials as appropriate.

- 4.3.1 Master of Photography M.Photog.
- 4.3.2 Master of Wedding Photography M.Wed.Photog.
- 4.3.3 Honorary Master of Photography Hon.M.Photog.
- 4.3.4 Master Artist M.Artist.
- 4.3.5 Master of Electronic Imaging MEI. (*this degree has been retired)
- 4.3.6 Photographic Craftsman Cr.
- 4.3.7 Honorary Photographic Craftsman Hon.Cr.Photog.
- 4.4 The Insignia for the degrees shall be hung on ribbons to be worn around the neck.
 - 4.4.1 Ribbons for combined degrees will be a combination of colors. The colors will appear in the order shown above, with the uppermost degree appearing on the outside of the ribbon.
 - 4.4.2 The ribbon Colors are as follows:
 - 4.4.2.1 Honorary Master of Photography (maroon and gold)
 - 4.4.2.2 Master of Photography (gold)
 - 4.4.2.3 Master of Wedding Photography (black)
 - 4.4.2.4 Master Artist (red)
 - 4.4.2.5 Honorary Photographic Craftsman (maroon and blue)
 - 4.4.2.6 Photographic Craftsman (blue)
 - 4.4.2.7 Master Artist (white -retired January 2011)
 - 4.4.2.8 Master of Electronic Imaging (red retired January 2011
- 4.5 A bar to be worn on the ribbons shall be awarded for each additional twenty-five (25) Merits earned beyond a degree. A silver star shall be placed midway on the right hand ribbon as the insignia of a Past President. A small "25" may be worn midway on the left hand ribbon as the insignia of members of the Twenty-Five year Club. A national Award pin or other PPA earned award may also be worn on the ribbon. No other insignia shall be worn on or attached to the ribbons.
- 4.6 The Board, upon recommendation of the Bylaws, Rules and Ethics Committee, may deprive individuals of Merits and Degrees for improper conduct.

- 2. Maximum 8 merits per person, per year.

COMMUNITY NETWORK MERIT CHART

NOTES:

- 1. Each network may hold one annual event per year with unlimited merits available for their 1 annual event.
- 2. Each network will receive a non-annual merit allotment of 40 merits per calendar year. This is in addition to the annual event.
- 3. All attendee merits are \$10 per merit. Attendee service merits are unlimited and do not count again a member's merit maximum (see #4).
- 4. Networks may award each PPA member a maximum of 4 merits total per year, 2 of which may be speaking merits. This does not apply to PPA Merit Program merits.
- 5. Members are eligible to receive merits for speaking, service, and judging within their own network.
- 6. Merits will not be issued to courses that compete against Imaging USA or other PPA events.
